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Nehemiah 1 – Nehemiah’s Prayer A.
Nehemiah hears of Jerusalem’s crisis condition. 1. Some 1,000 years after the time of Moses and some 400 years before the birth of Jesus, the nation of Israel and the Jewish people were in a desperate state.
Nehemiah 8 Commentary
The earliest Christian commentary on Ezra – Nehemiah is that of Bede

in the early 8th century. The fact that Ezra – Nehemiah was translated into Greek by the mid-2nd century BC suggests that this was the time by which it had come to be regarded as scripture. It was treated as a single book in the Hebrew, Greek and Old Latin manuscripts.
Enduring Word Bible Commentary
Nehemiah Chapter 8
Verse 1. - The words of Nehemiah the son of Hachaliah. Compare Jeremiah 1:1; Hosea 1:2; Amos 1:1, etc. No other historical book commences in this manner, and we may best account for the introduction of the clause by the consideration that "Nehemiah" having

been originally appended to "Ezra," it marked the point at which a new narrative began by a new author.

The first chapter of the Book of Nehemiah introduces the book bearing his name as a resident of Susa, the capital of the Persian Empire. When Nehemiah heard that the walls of Jerusalem were still broken down more than a half-century after the completion of the rebuilding of the temple, he “sat down and wept,” fasting and praying before God (Neh. 1:4).
